RECORD BREAKING YEAR

On March 15, 2019, Midwest Mission completed not 1, not 2, but 3, YES! 3 Shipments from our warehouse! The first shipment, which began loading at 9:00 AM, was with Food for the Poor (FFTP) going to El Rosario, Guatemala. We disbursed \$104,731 worth of school desks and supplies that FFTP then provided to Angels of Hope. Angels of Hope is a program that helps support children who



have been orphaned or abandoned in Caribbean and Latin American countries. They received 102 School Desks, 135 Youth Chairs, 5,042 One Handle School Bags, 5,788 Midwest Mission Student School Kits and 136 Air Fresheners.



The next two shipments were back-to-back and began at 11:00 AM for flooding in Iowa. Midwest Mission was able to complete a request for 4,032 UMCOR Cleaning Kits to help those affected by the statewide floods that hit Iowa. Midwest Mission had exactly 4,032 UMCOR Cleaning Kits onsite prepared and ready to go! It is so amazing to see God at work in this place every day in small ways and BIG ways like this one.



The first load went to Charles City in Northeast Iowa and the second load to Hinton in Northwest Iowa. While filling the first load, Midwest Mission received an unexpected donation of 33 UMCOR Cleaning Kit from the Mission Committee at UMC of the Dunes in Grand Haven, MI. These kits were immediately put on a pallet and wrapped to be put onto the second shipment for Iowa. To see God work his ways and provide in a time of need is just beautiful.

The last record-breaking God moment at Midwest Mission in 2019 was disbursing our largest-valued shipment ever. On 12/2/2019 we sent \$401,655.25 to FFTP who sent the items to New Horizons Foundation for the Poor in San Salvador, El Salvador. Loaded onto this shipment was tarps that were once old road side build boards from Lamar Advertising, church pews, youth school desk chairs from Burlington, Iowa, fire equipment from the fire department in Minister, IN and Midwest Mission School Kits. New Horizons seeks to develop programs, projects, and activities in order to promote welfare and social development to improve the living



conditions of Salvadoran families with limited economic resources. New Horizons does this by managing housing projects for low-income families, promoting and developing ecological projects, developing training on the importance of soy & rice, and developing education courses to help train, advise, and teach computer skills and reading habits. These supplies will keep the work of this non-profit going as it serves those who, at a time of crisis, need assistance the most. Thank you to all those that donate their time, talents and treasures to Midwest Mission. It is your hearts and hands that transform God's resources into humanitarian relief which allows us to reach those in need around the world and around the corner. 

HURRICANE RELIEF

Disaster Relief Kits are sent to people who lack access to essential supplies after a disaster strikes.
Midwest Mission distributed \$362,791.12 in Hurricane Relief Supplies.



BAHAMAS

In August, one of the most intense tropical cyclones on record hit the Bahamas. With winds up to 185 mph causing \$8.25 billion in damage and taking 63 lives, it is now regarded as one of the worst natural disasters in the country's history

Midwest Mission was able to get out in front of the disaster by teaming with Food for the Poor (FFTP) and staging supplies for hurricane relief. We sent the first shipment on May 12 that had 3,200 buckets and lids which could be used for storing clean water or as a cleaning bucket. On May 23, we sent 4,949 rice meals, thousands of hospital blankets and sheets, along with 56 more empty buckets. We were called upon by FFTP once the Hurricane hit and it was determined what supplies were needed for the area. On October 7 and 29 we sent hygiene supplies, bottled water, one gallon and 5 gallon jugs to store water, boys and girls outfits, quilts/blankets, baby sweaters, medical supplies, trash bags, shovels, flashlights, hammers and tarps. In all, we sent the Bahamas \$347,271.12 worth of natural disaster relief supplies. FFTP would have continued to make requests for supplies from Midwest Mission to continue to help those still suffering from the hurricane, but the Bahamas enforced tariffs which lowered the amount of shipments FFTP could afford to send in.



Michelle Cove with Trans Island Airways reported from the Bahamas that she was working the primary relief effort and was able to hand out our "lovely personal gift packages". Michelle stated how much these packages were appreciated.

GREAT FLOOD OF 2019

The Midwestern United States experienced major flooding from mid-March to late July in 2019, primarily along the Missouri River and its branches in Nebraska, Missouri, South Dakota, Iowa, and Kansas. The Mississippi River also saw flooding, although starting later and ending earlier. The 2019 January-to-May period was the wettest on record for the U.S., with multiple severe weather outbreaks through May in the Midwest. Throughout late May and early June, rain in Iowa, Illinois, and Missouri caused every site on the Mississippi River to record a top-five crest. At least three people in Iowa and Nebraska died. Nearly 14 million people in the midwestern and southern states were affected by the flooding, which the New York Times called "The Great Flood of 2019". New record river levels were set in 42 different locations. At least 1 million acres of U.S. farmland in nine major grain producing states were flooded with 2.9 billion in property damage for the midwestern states. Midwest Mission was able to respond with UMCOR Disaster Supplies by delivering UMCOR Cleaning, School and Hygiene Kits to 14 locations. Thanks be to God for giving us the needed supplies and missionaries to help those devastated by these floods.

Midwest Mission was able to send a total of four shipments to Guatemala with Food for the Poor this year. Three of those shipments went to Colonia El Rosario, Zone 3 of Mixco, Guatemala with the nonprofit Caritas Arquidiocesana. Caritas Arquidiocesana is a foundation of social assistance of the Archbishopric of Santiago de Guatemala, which manages and facilitates resources to transform communities and lives, following the example of Christ, through programs and projects, bringing the most needy to the realization of the Plan of God. In the shipments that Midwest Mission sent on Feb. 4th, March 15th, and Dec. 10th we provided \$329,420.97 worth of supplies consisting of:

- 23,377 Health Supplies
- 15,002 Education Supplies
- 49 Bikes/Sewing Machines
- 5,376 Layette Items/Kits
- 4,990 Natural Disaster Supplies
- 7,357 Pieces of Clothing
- 381 Toys
- 24 Pews /Furniture
- 1,068 Quilts

FFTP provided us with a report on how your donations helped little Guadalupe López in Guatemala. Fifteen-month-old Guadalupe lives with her father, Imer, and three siblings in a settlement located around a garbage dump in Zone 3 of Guatemala City. Families who live in Zone 3 live in extreme poverty and most of the families make a living from the garbage, which they use for recycling and sometimes for consumption. Guadalupe's mother, Glenda, is currently incarcerated and her father struggles to support the family. With Guadalupe still an infant, and Imer not able to make enough money to pay for a babysitter, he is unable to find employment. Guadalupe's father and her aunt, who lives nearby, wake up at 4 a.m. to prepare food that they sell on the streets. Imer and his family were referred to Caritas by social workers who were assessing the living situation of families living in Zone 3. Imer visited Caritas and received clothing for Guadalupe along with other essential items. He said that every day he lives in fear that his children will be removed from his care. Imer added that he is extremely grateful to receive assistance from Caritas, which explained to him that this help is possible due to donations received from FFTP donors like Midwest Mission. "Thank you to all who have a part in making this possible for us," Imer said. "You have helped better the lives for me and my family, and helped restore my faith in believing that things can and will get better for us." Midwest Mission wants to thank again all those that donate to help children like Guadalupe receive supplies during a desperate time of need.





WHEELCHAIR TO WOODJY

On September 25 2018, you may recall, we received notice from Jacqueline Parks Raitano that there was a request for a youth sized wheelchair for Woodjy Luis Pierre who lives in La Victorie, Haiti. Midwest Mission was able to locate a wheelchair and the Raitano family arrived at the end of October and to pick it up and deliver it to Karina Paul in Chicago whose husband is the Executive Director of Sustainable Action International.

This is when Midwest Mission found out more about how this request initially transpired: it came from Sustainable Action International out of Haiti. Their vision is to bring the hope of Christ to Haiti by creating and cultivating a sustainable future by building clean water wells, elementary and high schools, churches, and mission houses.

The wheelchair was scheduled to be shipped in November of 2018 but due to the protests and riots taking place in Haiti, Sustainable Action International's mission trip was canceled and they were not able to get it delivered.

Your continued prayers for this beautiful young boy worked and he finally received his youth sized wheelchair this November. We are told he moves around well and he is so happy to be in school. He is in the 1st grade and he is super smart!

Thanks to God and to all the others who had a hand in getting Woodjy the much-needed wheelchair that allows him to travel all over his village now. His smile is truly priceless and shows the amazing work that God does through our ministry. To learn more about Sustainable Action International go to: sai-haiti.org

Midwest Mission takes donations of new or slightly used medical supplies and equipment. These supplies are typically sent internationally with our Food for the Poor and Military Partners.

Midwest Mission is currently accepting wheelchairs, walkers, crutches, canes, orthopedic supplies, and bedside commodes that must be clean, sanitized, and with the buckets and lids.

We are unable to accept medications and shower chairs.

Rice Meal Information: (\$1 Value / \$0.16 per meal)

This kit is made on-site at your location with a 600-pack minimum within 60 miles. Over 60 miles there is a 1200-pack minimum unless your organization picks up and returns the equipment. Your organization pays \$1 for every bag plus mileage (at the IRS rate of \$0.58 per mile) and lodging, if necessary (\$100). MMDC will bring all the equipment. The organization needs to provide tables and labor. 8-10 people can pack 125 bags (750 meals) in an hour. We can host up to 14 lines. All meals go to nonprofits internationally or for use in disaster relief. Midwest Mission will be able to report to your group where your Rice Meals have been sent. PRAYERS FOR LITTLE LAMBS

Kristin Schattschneider with Little Lambs Learning Center Uganda in Kampala Uganda reported that the \$500 worth of supplies (school, hygiene, and cleaning) donated on 6/7/19 and 7/8/19 are assisting their education program which currently has 22 children enrolled. Kristin told us that 13 of these children are currently being sponsored by monetary donations. She went on to say that the Midwest Mission school supplies have helped them to carry out their daily lessons, the cleaning supplies are helping with the day to day cleaning to keep a clean and safe environment for the children, and the hygiene items have been used by the children and the staff to promote healthy hygiene. Kristin finished by stating that "Midwest Mission has been such a blessing to us. All the items that they have given to us would have needed to be purchased, which would have taken the funds away needed to run the learning program. This now allows us to spread the money that we get through donations a little bit further. Thank you Midwest Mission for your support."

Sadly, on December 14, 2019 Kristin Schattschnider was called by her father to join him in heaven after passing away unexpectedly. Kristin had been collaborating with Midwest Mission for almost two years, receiving school and hygiene items for her students in Uganda. Midwest Mission had the opportunity to provide a shipment of 68 Senior MMDC Desks to the Imagine Missions in Despinos, Croix des Bouquets, Haiti. Imagine Missions has been working since 2011 to provide a family and home environment for over 100 children and young adults in Despinos, Haiti. Through nutrition, education, a trade program, and spiritual and emotional mentoring, Imagine Missions seeks to prepare our children and youth for significant and successful adult lives invested in their community. They are currently restricting their mission to begin to turn their orphanage into a program that works to reunite families and provide everyone with resources. This will allow funds to be used to put more children in Haiti into school.
