

From a Broomstick to a New Beginning: Timotea's Story



Timotea hobbled into the Parish Clinic in Guastatoya, Guatemala, broomstick in hand. But it wasn't for sweeping—it was her makeshift cane, the only support she had to navigate the uneven floors of her home. It offered some balance, but not the stability she truly needed. Every step was a challenge.

This was a special day at the clinic. Patients were gathering in the large community room, many relying on broken-down wheelchairs, improvised mobility aids, or unsteady feet. But today, they would be receiving something life-changing: proper medical equipment tailored to their needs.

Each individual had been evaluated by the clinic's physical therapist, who took the time to understand their unique situations. In places like Guatemala, access to even the most basic medical supplies—like canes, walkers, or wheelchairs—is limited or unaffordable. For many, these items are completely out of reach.

Thankfully, the Parish Clinic, run by the local church, is bridging that gap. Through its partnership with Midwest Mission, Food For The Poor, and the Order of Malta, the clinic received a shipment of donated mobility aids—supplies that would drastically improve patients' quality of life.

Timotea was the first to be called forward.

Carefully, she stood up, leaning on her broomstick as she made her way across the room. The physical therapist greeted her with a real cane, adjusted it to the right height, and encouraged her to take a few steps.

Timotea's face lit up.

She smiled as she confidently walked —really walked—for the first time in years. Then, without hesitation, she handed over the broomstick. She wouldn't be needing it anymore.

Overcome with gratitude, Timotea thanked the staff and Midwest Mission for their generosity. The cane changed everything for her!

Now, she can go to the market. She can attend church. She can move around her home without fear. A simple cane gave her back her independence.



Blessing Bags Packed into School Bus that is Heading Towards Haiti!



This week, we had an unusual shipment leave this warehouse!

4,800 Rice and Soy Blessing Bags are on their way to Haiti, but this time, the mode of transportation is a little different. All the Blessing Bags were packed into a school bus, along with donated items from other organizations!

Hosean International Ministries (HIM Haiti) has worked in Haiti for over 40 years, bringing hope and real help to the people of Haiti. Their staff of 150 Haitians works with international partners from the United States, Brazil, and Canada.

Midwest Mission was connected to Hosean International Ministries through Gene Turner, who was formerly our Mission in Motion Manager. Gene's father-in-law, Bernie, volunteers at HIM Haiti for over six months every year. He shared about needs the organization had, and ways they could ship the supplies into Haiti.

Last year, on a trip to Haiti, Gene and Bernie delivered Blessing Bags, medical supplies, Little Boy's and Girl's Outfits, and other requested items. The

response from the recipients was full of gratitude.

Now, over a year later, Haiti is still in turmoil, and is in desperate need of supplies. When Bernie called Brad Walton, Director of Operations, inquiring about a joint-partnership shipment, we were elated! It's been almost exactly one year since we've been able to ship to Haiti, with our last shipment leaving the warehouse on September 4, 2024. The ports have been closed for much of the year, but now, the port in Cap Haitian is open, and we were eager to get supplies in.





HIM Haiti received a school bus from a donor in Wisconsin for their school. But, if they were shipping a school bus, they needed to fill it first!

So, on Wednesday, September 10, the bus rolled onto campus and Ramon Ortiz, Operations Manager, and a team of volunteers packed four pallets of meals into the bus. The remainder of the bus was filled with a variety of other supplies that had previously been loaded onto the bus.



From Midwest Mission, the bus will be driven down to Miami, where it will be loaded onto a container, and shipped on a boat to the Cap Haitian port.

Volunteers serving at Midwest Mission on Wednesday were very excited to pray over the bus, and hear from Bernie himself about the great work that is happening in Haiti.

Please continue to pray over this shipment, that it will safely arrive and be distributed. Pray for the people of Haiti — for safety, for the ability to receive needed supplies, and for the turmoil to come to an end.

We praise God that the ports have opened, and hope in the form of Blessing Bags will soon be in the hands of the hungry!

- parent or guardian ahead of time if not accompanying their child).
- We ask that participants wear closed-toe shoes. Hairnets, beard nets, and gloves will be provided.



When Emmanuel UMC heard about the goal of collecting 2,500 Student Kits, they knew they wanted to help.

Their church family came together to donate all the needed supplies, and two women from the congregation sewed every one-handled bag!

On Thursday, September 11th, 31 volunteers gathered to assemble an impressive 120 Student Kits.

But they didn't stop there. A member of their missions team who works at a local assisted living facility invited the residents to join in — and they lovingly packed an additional 25 Kits, bringing Emmanuel UMC's total to 145 Student Kits!

St. Joseph UMC also embraced the challenge of 2,500 Kits and got creative with their approach.

Their team sewed one-handled bags and tucked a Student Kit shopping list in each. On Sunday morning, they hung the bags on the pews and encouraged members to take and fill as many as they could throughout July and August.

Then, after a Sunday service, they hosted a joy-filled packing event, followed by a pizza lunch! Together, they assembled 109 Student Kits.

On September 12, they delivered the completed Kits and additional supplies to Midwest Mission.

49th International Shipment of the Year!



On Thursday, September 18, we sent out our 49th international shipment of the year. This leaves us one shipment away from hitting our goal of 50 international shipments this year!

The supplies are headed toward San Pedro Sula, Honduras through our partner Food For The Poor. Once supplies are in-country, our partner CEPUDO will distribute the requested items to organizations around the country.

This shipment included:

- 560 Personal Dignity Kits
- 6 Treadle Sewing Machines
- 7 Electric Sewing Machines
- 2 Sergers
- 50 Sleeping Mats
- 140 Little Girls' Outfits
- 91 Cover Them With Love Quilts
- 41 Mattresses
- Tarps
- Canes, crutches, and walkers
- Cleaning Supplies
- Medical Supplies

The value of this shipment was \$166,812.50.

At this time, available shipping containers are few and far between. Please be praying that more containers become available so we can continue shipping out needed resources to people around the world.



The Mission Around the Corner: Meeting Local Needs in Indianapolis



Oftentimes, when we think of missions, we picture children and families in foreign countries with hungry stomachs and a lack of resources. Sadly, this is a reality in many places, but we often forget that there are also people in need of basic resources right here in the United States.

The mission is right around the corner—we just have to open our eyes to it.

Recently, Midwest Mission was able to send kits and items to a ministry in Indianapolis, Indiana, that addresses the needs they see right in their community. The ministry is called Soup's On. It was founded out of Roberts Park UMC twentysix years ago when a member of the church took notice of a need right in the church's vicinity: all of the nearby shelters were closed on Sundays, meaning homeless individuals in their community were going without food for a whole day, if not longer. This realization drove Soup's On to become a ministry dedicated to feeding those in need every Sunday at noon.

Still today, it is a refuge where people can receive a warm, nourishing meal. However, it's much more than just a place where the unhoused and unemployed can get a bite to eat.



Soup's On strives to meet guests' spiritual, emotional, and practical needs. Which is where Midwest Mission was able to enter the story, thanks to Mary Marty!

Mary, who is a volunteer at Midwest Mission and Soup's On, arranged for Midwest Mission Kits and items to be delivered to the pantry, where they would be distributed to those in need of hygiene items like deodorant, shampoo, conditioner, toothpaste, and more. Now, guests who visit Soup's On for a filling meal, get to leave with arms full of items that will bring dignity and empowerment.

Because someone saw a need in their community and took steps to address it, lives are being transformed. **This is possible no matter where you are.** The need isn't always an ocean away; it just might be around your corner.

50th International Shipment of the Year!



We have officially met our goal for 2025, and it's only September On Thursday, September 25th, we sent out our 50th international shipment of the year!

The supplies are headed to Guatemala through our partner Food For The Poor.

This shipment included:

- 13 Electric Sewing Machines
- 312 Layette Kits
- 1,680 Personal Dignity Kits
- 40 Twin Hospital Bed Mattresses
- 314 Scrubber Sponges
- Clothing
- Sewing Items
- Fabric

The value of this shipment was \$191,921.10.

We are beyond excited to reach our goal of 50 international shipments! We recognize that accomplishments such as this wouldn't be possible without dedicated volunteers, partners, and givers. So, we just want to thank everyone who made these shipments possible!




