Three International Shipments in one Week!



Just when we think things have slowed down, we turn around and there is even more to do! This week we were blessed to have three international shipments, which will now make a total of 34 shipments for this year!

There are so many steps that go into

a shipment, some bigger than others, and some that may even go unnoticed. But nonetheless, each one plays an important role, and together they create something truly beautiful. From receiving donations, unpacking and sorting every single item, to packing kits and supplies and loading them onto the truck. It's all a process that takes many hands and hearts to accomplish. Not to mention the special moments shared with volunteers and staff as we talk about



the supplies, where they're going, and end with a prayer.

Shipments are incredibly important to all of us here at Midwest Mission. They are a chance to praise God for all the work He has done and an opportunity to help those in need. We couldn't think of a better way to celebrate our freedom this 4th of July than by celebrating our ability to serve the Lord and help others!

The first shipment was an Angels of Hope shipment sent to San Pedro Sula. Honduras to our partner CEPUDO, through Food for the Poor. It included:

- 480 Home Care Kits
- Mattresses and bed packs
- 35 Quilts
- Toys and Games
- 560 Personal Dignity Kits
- Scrubber Sponges

Value: \$36,331.00

The second shipment was sent to Georgetown, Guyana through Food for the Poor. It included:

- 24 Sewing machines and sewing supplies
- 5,331 disposable diapers
- 159 woven sleeping mats
- 116 walkers
- 54 pairs of crutches
- 86 canes
- 10 wheelchairs
- Tons of medical supplies and equipment
- 475 Baby items
- 142 Hygiene supplies
- 142 School supplies

Value: \$172,719.50

The third shipment of the week was also sent to San Pedro Sula to our partner CEPUDO through Food for the Poor. This shipment included:

- 40 mattresses
- 114 bed packs
- 58 sewing machines along with 290 Miscellaneous sewing supplies
- 870 birthing kits
- 888 Layette Kits
- 205 Feminine Hygiene Kits
- 57 Walkers

- 30 wheelchairs
- 3,600 Rice and Soy Blessing Bags to feed 21,600 people
- Tons of Fire Equipment (Boots, gloves, helmets, jackets, pants)
- 218 little boy outfits and 135 little girl outfits

Transforming Health and Hope in Trujillo, Honduras!



In Honduras, poverty is a prevalent issue for nearly half of the population. This is due to factors such as limited access to education, health care, and basic services and necessities. Other elements like

violence, natural disasters and political instability only make poverty a never ending cycle. Thankfully, there are some amazing organizations that work together to respond to natural disasters, environmental education, and increasing climate change preparedness in countries like Honduras. CEPUDO is a nongovernmental organization that is based in Honduras, and they focus on eliminating poverty and managing some of these issues and providing stability. In addition, CEPUDO collaborates with local communities and different international partners like Midwest Mission to foster a stronger and more sustainable future for people in Honduras.

Before receiving support, Hospital Salvador Paredes in Trujillo was in extremely poor condition. The facility lacked essential medical supplies and equipment, making it nearly impossible to provide even basic care. Patients suffered, and many doctors and nurses faced their own health



challenges due to the harsh conditions and limited resources. Without the proper tools, the hospital staff struggled to meet the needs of those they were so desperately trying to help.

When Midwest Mission learned of the situation, we knew we had to act—and fast. Because of the compassion and generosity of our donors, we were able to step in and make a difference. Thanks to the outpouring of support, we sent vital supplies including sewing machines, Birthing Kits, bicycles, mattresses, and blankets. Each of these items filled a unique and pressing need at Hospital Salvador Paredes and in the surrounding communities.

"We want to express our sincere gratitude for your generous donation, which has been of great help to the different services of our Salvador Paredes Hospital," said Mareza Zepeda, head of the Neonatology Department. She went on to explain how the supplies are improving their ability to care for patients—offering a renewed sense of hope and dignity to those they serve.

The impact extended beyond the hospital walls. Sewing machines were distributed to the Departmental Institution La Independencia in Santa Barbara, where students are learning valuable trade skills that can lead to sustainable livelihoods. Blankets, a simple but important gift, provided warmth and comfort to families who previously went without. Parents are now able to give their children a safer and more restful place to sleep.

In addition, families received much-needed basic hygiene items—things many of us in America take for granted, items like wet wipes, baby creams, powders, and more. Bicycles were awarded to students who excel academically in underserved areas, encouraging their education while also providing practical transportation.

Mareza Zepeda expressed deep gratitude for the donations and shared how the kindness and generosity of Midwest Mission supporters have truly transformed lives.

None of this would be possible without you, our generous donors. Your willingness to give is what enables us to respond quickly and compassionately in times of need. Thank you for being the hands and feet of hope. Together, we are making a tangible difference, one life at a time. REYOAD Campers Bring Hope, One Kit at a Time!










In June of this year, over 100 campers and volunteers gathered at Camp REYOAD to assemble Student Kits and Personal Dignity Kits. The staff guided the campers through the process, teaching them the purpose of the kits, how to put them together, where they would be sent, and how deeply they would be appreciated by those who receive them.

All of the campers are adults (18 years and older) who are differently-abled. Together, the REYOAD campers assembled 50 Student Kits and 50 Personal Dignity Kits! At first, the group wasn't sure how they would secure the funding to make the project possible. The desire to serve was strong, but the financial resources just weren't there. 

Our 40th International Shipment this Year!



This week we were blessed enough to send two more international shipments! That makes 40 international shipments in 2025! Which means we are only 10 shipments away from reaching our goal for the entire year!

The first shipment went to Tegucigalpa, Honduras through our partner Food for the Poor. It included:

• 4,800 Blessing Bags

- 280 Personal Dignity Kits
- 48 Sewing Machines
- 74 Walkers
- 60 Canes
- 30 Mattresses
- 120 Pairs of Crutches
- 2,342 Pieces of clothing
- Miscellaneous Baby Items
- Miscellaneous Medical supplies
- Hygiene Supplies
- Tables & Chairs

Value: \$115,591.00

The second shipment went to Jamaica through our partner Food for the Poor. It included:

- 81 Bed Springs
- 162 Head and footboards
- 81 Twin Hospital Bed Mattresses
- 16 sets of sheets

Value: \$39,524.00

Compared to some of our previous shipments, these two were on the smaller side, but that doesn't mean they were any less impactful! They included essential supplies that will make a significant difference.

The second shipment, in particular, included beds that had been specifically requested, and we were honored to make it happen.

We had recently received a generous donation of mattresses from both Illinois State University and The College of Wooster. Our Executive Director, Chantel Corrie, received a call from Wooster's materials manager asking if we happened to accept mattresses, as they were in the process of replacing theirs. After inspecting the beds and confirming we could take them, we returned a few weeks later to pick them up. So when we later received a call requesting beds, it felt like a perfect little God moment. We're incredibly grateful that the mattresses came at just the right time. All the glory goes to God!

These shipments are a perfect example of our commitment to only sending what is truly needed. We pride ourselves on responding directly to requests, and never sending excess items that weren't needed. It's important to us to honor what people ask for, and that's exactly what we did here.

Sending shipments like these brings us so much joy. It's heartwarming to know that we can help so many people with such simple, yet vital, resources. And none of it would be possible without our generous donors and amazing volunteers who give their time and talents to pack and prepare these supplies.


A senior assisted living facility in Minnesota showed great interest, so Jacky and a few members of the church spent a few hours there teaching them to make their first mat.
