Dear Midwest Mission Partners,

It has been another year full of miracles and witnessing God's amazing timing. We have stayed faithful and his abundance abounds. As I reflect each year, I have to pinch myself because it just seems too good to be true.

Our mission is to transform the resources of God's people into humanitarian relief and we did that this year at a break-neck pace turning every dollar spent into \$7.66 of supplies that were sent out in 33 international and 256 domestic shipments. Thank you for all the ways you partner with Midwest Mission to make sending hope at this level possible. The world is weary, people are at odds but mission is a ray of sunshine that allows us to meet practical needs and show God's love. This is why it is so important to include our prayer card with each Midwest Mission kit. We believe that every item that leaves Midwest Mission is a gift from all those who have had a part in making that happen, and most importantly is a gift from God. We want people to know that. It is more meaningful, relational, personal. When you give a gift you give a card. When you give a card you sign it. This is why we ask people making kits to pray over the card and as they do, to think about the person receiving it and sign their name. The little things matter.

One early morning as I was preparing to go and speak at a church I felt the Lord prodding me to check my email. Anyone that knows me knows I usually don't have extra time, so I continued to get ready. As I was reading the scripture this nudging continued. I checked my email and found a note from a woman in Guatemala who had been volunteering at an orphanage and was feeling disillusioned because she was not able to help meet basic needs. She said our kits showed up and it reinvigorated her because it reminded her that her brothers and sisters in Christ had not forgotten her or these children. We have the privilege of bringing hope to those who are serving and those being served. We get to make them feel seen and help them understand their value. We get to be their cheering section and remind them that the Lord will provide.

At Midwest Mission, we are passionate about helping people meet basic needs and growing disciples.

I encourage you to not just serve, but to boldly invite others to serve with you so they can experience the overwhelming joy that comes from blessing others. There are many ways to come into a relationship with Christ and service is, by far, one of the best ways to present the least amount of apprehension and remove barriers for the unchurched.

Plus, we have seen exponential growth in off-site hosted events. As groups and individuals utilize the expertise and resources Midwest Mission has to offer we plan to continue to increase these events. They were created to be fast and simple, yet provide great multigenerational and community fellowship, build mission muscle and provide opportunities to invite non-church members to serve.

These opportunities can be utilized by churches of any size and we are here to be your guide. Invigorate your congregation, spark new interest and reach people in need by hosting a Midwest Mission event. Keep reading this report to discover how you can engage in the ministry of Midwest Mission.

We need your help to meet our big goals for 2022. We want to send three containers a month from Midwest Mission, one of those being an Angels of Hope container. In order to do that we need to make 15,000 Personal Dignity Kits, 15,000 Student Kits, 8,700 Home Care Kits, 1,000 Layette Kits, 778 Birthing Kits and 60,000 rice meal packages. We are also working with our United States Military on their Resolute Sentinel Mission happening in 2022. We will be supporting the Guatemala location that is building two schools and a clinic. The military will build the buildings and get supplies in country and to the facilities.

We go into 2022 with grateful hearts filled with excitement to see what God has in store as we prepare to reach even more people in Christ's name. We are your partner in ministry and want to continue to work and learn from you so we can make the biggest impact for Christ.



KENTUCKY TORNADO

One deadly EF4 tornado tracking 165.65 miles ripped through 11 western Kentucky counties the weekend of Dec. 10-11. Confirmed deaths numbered 77. Multiple churches, business and more than 1,000 homes were damaged or obliterated. Midwest Mission took immediate action, filling and sending a 28-foot trailer with 5,000 lbs. of supplies, including tarps, buckets, 60 cases of disinfectant wipes, several 18-gallon totes, shovels, flashlights, hammers, nails, screws and more. Volunteers also stepped up to prepare tornado kits and made financial donations to help in recovery.

GIBSON CITY FLOODING

On Aug. 12, Gibson City, Illinois experienced 9.5 to 10 inches of rainfall in just over six hours causing mass flooding. Many homes and businesses sustained heavy damage and several roads were impassable.

The IGRC Emergency Response Team headed to Gibson City to help with the clean-up efforts. Midwest Mission delivered 72 UMCOR Cleaning Kits, hand sanitizer and heavy-duty garbage bags on Tuesday, Aug. 17.

U.S. DISASTER RELIEF

In 2021, Midwest Mission quickly responded to 11 U.S. disasters to provide relief from floods, hurricanes, fires and tornadoes.

MIDWEST MISSION IS AN UMCOR AFFILATED DEPOT

The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is Midwest Mission's domestic relief partner. There are seven affiliate UMCOR Depots and Midwest Mission works closely with them. During the pandemic this relationship has grown even stronger. UMCOR Sager Brown has been closed to volunteers during the pandemic. Midwest Mission, though, was able to continue hosting, in order to keep enough verified kits in the network. UMCOR Sager Brown sent supplies to Midwest Mission to verify and build kits. "We are a connectional church and that includes our depots. We are there to help each other. That is the beauty of the Methodist connection," said Executive Director, Chantel Corrie. When a disaster happens, supply requests are ordered. UMCOR Sager Brown staff looks to see which depot works best logistically and lets that depot know. Midwest Mission commits to making deliveries from its facility happen within 24 hours.

LOUISIANA FACES HURRICANE IDA





Louisiana faced Hurricane Ida as she brushed the eastern coastline at the end of August. The brutal hurricane left her mark as hundreds of thousands of people lost their homes, power and vehicles. More than 90 lives were lost. New Orleans residents struggled to reach 911 or other help, as a result of massive power outages.

The Category 4 winds and changing weather also generated 37 tornadoes that wreaked havoc across the Southeastern and Northeastern U.S.

Midwest Mission sent UMCOR Cleaning Kits and Hygiene kits to replenish the inventory UMCOR Sager Brown had sent out in response to the disaster.

NATIVE AMERICAN

In 2021, Midwest Mission sent \$324,302 worth of supplies to seven different organizations that support Native Americans.





AICM STUFF THE BUS PROJECT

The American Indian Christian Mission (AICM) raised funds and bought two school buses from a school district in Indiana. Jeff Cline, the executive director of AICM, visited Midwest Mission and during a conversation with Operations Manager, Brad Walton, mentioned that the school buses were going from Indiana to Arizona in July. Brad got to work and found out what was needed by the AICM in Arizona.

On Tuesday morning, July 27, the two school buses pulled into Midwest Mission and our mission volunteers, staff and the volunteer bus drivers all worked together and stuffed those buses with 100 twin-size mattresses, UMCOR Hygiene Kits, UMCOR School Kits and donations from Delta Airlines. The items were valued at \$37,828. The buses reached their destination at the American Indian Christian Mission in Show Low, AZ. Director Chantel Corrie got to see them first-hand and tour the facility in November. "It was great to see the new buses in the parking lot and mattresses in the student dorms. The staff here is incredible. Many of the teachers have been there for a long time and some were students there."

CHEYENNE RIVER YOUTH PROJECT

On March 4, Midwest Mission disbursed 600 UMCOR Hygiene Kits and 800 UMCOR School Kits to the Cheyenne River Youth Project (CRYP). Then on Aug. 8 sent 504 Hygiene and 504 School Kits worth \$28,096

CRYP provides a youth center that offers a recreation room, library, family room and other resources where the building of hope and community are evident.

RESPONSE SENT TO REFUGEES

7,344 UMCOR HYGIENE KITS
1,000 CASES OF HAND SANITIZER

With the help of local partner, RefugeeOne, more than 1,500 Afghans made their home in Chicago, among hundreds of other refugees from different parts of the world. The refugees were instrumental in saving the lives of Americans, and the gift was gladly reciprocated.

Midwest Mission Distribution Center partnered with RefugeeOne by providing hygiene kits and supplies to ensure provision of basic needs was met. The goal was to help them adjust more easily to their new life and surroundings.

Many of the refugees were setting up their first apartments, their own living spaces for the first time. After being greeted at the airport and receiving a warm welcome to Chicago, RefugeeOne assisted them with next steps. They offered English classes, youth programming, employment assistance, mental health care and other initiatives to help them thrive in the place they would call home.





Midwest Mission sent 1,296 UMCOR Hygiene Kits and 1,000 bottles of hand sanitizer in two shipments to Chicago. The kits, valued at \$10,296, were given to the Afghan refugees who were provided shelter and aid through the Red Cross and RefugeeOne. Midwest Mission also sent toothpaste.

In addition, 6048 Hygiene Kits were sent to Catholic Charities in Green Bay, WI for the refugees placed there. Value \$78,624

Our ministry will continue to provide assistance as needs are requested.

International Disaster Response

We partner with Food For The Poor and the U.S. Military when international disaster strikes. They ship for us for FREE.

PRE-STAGING FOR INTERNATIONAL RESPONSE

Midwest Mission works with Food For The Poor to pre-stage for disasters in the U.S. and in 10 Latin American and Caribbean countries. To the right is a picture of the pre-staged items getting handed out in Haiti along with the supplies from other partners. These kits were also already on the ground when the volcano erupted on the island of St. Vincent, displacing an estimated 23,400 people to the southern end of St. Vincent and the Grenadines, as well as other neighboring countries. If disaster doesn't affect a country that was pre-staged, items are dispersed in December for humanitarian aid. FFTP and Midwest Mission also pre-stage items in Florida so if something happens in the Caribbean it is close to be quickly airlifted. Tarps, blankets, work gloves and cleaning supplies were some of the items staged in 2021, totaling \$341,163.04.



Jisabelle Garcia-Pedroso, Food For The Poor senior programs manager of operations, wrote, "Because of your support to prepare together as partners, United in God's Work, YOU were already present in Haiti delivering aid within 24 hours!"

DEADLY HAITI EARTHQUAKE

On Aug. 14, 2021, the coast of Haiti was struck by a deadly earthquake. The magnitude of the earthquake was 7.2 and many buildings and homes were destroyed. The death toll climbed to 2,248 people. Thousands of people were injured and missing. Midwest Mission received an urgent needs request and was able to send a container out six days later on Aug. 20. This shipment, worth over \$126,171.58, was distributed through our partnership with Food For The Poor. Some of the items included in this shipment were plastic totes, clothing, Personal Dignity Kits, orthopedic supplies and hand sanitizer. In 2021, Midwest Mission sent five containers to Haiti. Value: \$699,920.26

HELP FOR HONDURAS

Choloma is an extremely poor region in the department of Cortes, located in the eastern region of the Sula Valley. Known as the "City of the Textile Industry" Choloma is the third-largest city in Honduras with a population of 263,232.

Some residents work as "pickers" recycling inorganic items like iron, plastic and glass from the municipal landfill. They work up to 12 hours daily, earning very little income. Unfortunately, families in this work often eat rice, beans and corn tortillas found in the dump.

They live in houses made of scrap material. They are at the mercy of the elements, surrounded by bugs, garbage and foul odors. The "best" houses here are made of bajareque — essentially mud and sticks — and they run the risk of becoming infected by bugs and parasites that reside within the walls of their huts. Other families live in shacks made of cardboard, plastic or other materials found at the dump.

The current school was constructed approximately two years ago through our partner Food For The Poor. Since that time, the student population has increased to the point that further expansion is needed. Next year, the school expects to have more than 1,000 students. To help accommodate this increase, classes will be taught in separate sessions, two in the morning and two in the afternoon, and this will still not be enough to accommodate all of the students.

Medical Supplies and Equipment Provide Blessings

The Jehovah Rapha Health Center's mission is to help the most vulnerable, and it does so by offering unprecedented support to health institutions in the northern and northeastern parts of Haiti.

During one recent distribution, the head of the Jehovah Rapha Health Center had the opportunity to testify to the donations received from Food For The Poor (FFTP) - Haiti's northern warehouse.

"Thanks to FFTP's generous in-kind donors, we're able to distribute much-needed pharmaceutical and medical products to health centers throughout the country," she said. "Every day, we receive a quantity of 20 patients and most of them come from the town of Caracol and neighboring towns such as: Limonade, Trou-du-Nord and Fort-Liberté."

The Jehovah Rapha Health Center offers general and prenatal consultation, physiotherapy, gynecology and emergency services. "Thanks to the support of FFTP," she continued, "I no longer have to worry about the medical stock because every two months the center receives medical materials from the FFTP North warehouse. Food For The Poor gives us the courage to keep fighting for a better tomorrow.

"On behalf of all the staff of the center, I say thank you and we will always be grateful to you for all the good work you are doing in Haiti, especially in the health field. In this moment of crisis, the country really needs this kind of project with lasting impacts for vulnerable and remote communities."

FULLFILLING A NEW MOTHER'S WISH

Midwest Mission sent Layette Kits to Corpus Christi Hospital, located in Patzún, Guatemala. For 33 years, the hospital has provided medical consultations to children and adults who have limited economic resources. Its main objective is to provide health care access to those who would not be able to obtain care. New moms lined up to receive the donated baby supplies.

Those who were fortunate enough to receive the Layette Kits for their babies were extremely grateful. Layette Kits are always welcomed by new moms because they allow them to provide another extension of care to their children. The distribution of Layette Kits to mothers of newborn babies also brought hope and joy to the hospital workers as they shared them.

There is much love poured into the kits as Midwest Mission volunteers prepare them. It's a humbling experience we get to share in and hearing stories like Luz's below is heart-warming.

Luz Madely Velásquex is only 5 months old and the youngest of two siblings. Her parents are Carolina Miculax, 26, a housewife, and Abner Neftalí Velásquez, 29, who works for a construction supply distributor. His salary is approximately \$167 per month, and is the family's full income. They live in a village called Mocdit Xot Bajo, located in the Patzún. It is a rural area with few resources, resulting in many daily challenges for the family.

Our in-country partner said Luz's mother was immensely grateful for the donation she received from Midwest Mission Distribution Center, as it provided fresh new clothes to keep her baby warm during the cold season in Guatemala.

God is so fun! Someone "happened" to drop off a children's bike that same day. Amazingly, it was the exact size needed for her toddler and became an unexpected Christmas gift. We are blessed to be a place where God answers prayers in surprising ways.

Bikes and sewing machines empower recipients' personal growth

A bicycle can provide needed transportation to work, school and for errands like going to the store or doctor. Bikes can also be instrumental in garnering delivery jobs in some countries, as an additional way to earn income. We also have a process to provide bikes to children who may not otherwise have one. Sewing machines are another tool we provide to help establish business and independence for those who need a hand up. In many developing countries, women can learn to sew and use the skill to earn income for their family. Midwest Mission repairs electric and treadle machines to assist in this endeavor.

The Angels of Hope child sponsorship program provides approximately 6,500 children in need in the Caribbean and Latin America with a life-changing opportunity for a better future. There are nine homes and 276 children in the Angels of Hope program in El Salvador. It is evident that the Home Care and Personal Dignity Kits are essential for each home.

The children and home administrators are truly grateful for this support and look forward to continuing this relationship. Thank you, Midwest Mission, for joining us in this effort to change the lives of vulnerable children.

In 2021, Midwest Mission stretched its limits by doing 33 food packing events in seven different states (IA, IN, IL, MI, MO, OH, WI) feeding 320,706 individuals.

Rice Meals were distributed in Villa Nueva located in the metropolitan area of Guatemala City, where there is rampant poverty and the unemployment rate is high.

The rice casserole meals were a welcome relief to the beneficiaries in Guatemala, especially to Ramón Tubac, 27, who depends on his crops to feed his family of five. He grows corn and beans for a living and sells firewood when he can. His gross monthly income is approximately Q250 (approximately \$32).

His wife, María Lobos, 26, is a housewife. She stays home to care for the children. Their oldest is 11 and the youngest is 8 months old. She often worries about where their next meal will come from and is concerned over their children's health.

"Dear Lord, Thank you for providing this nutritious meal. Bless the food and allow it to nourish and energize my children's bodies," said María, when given the gift of rice casserole meals.

Another recipient of the donation was Dilma Ramos, 22, and her husband, Juan Adolfo Méndez, 25. He works as a farmer three times a week and earns a monthly salary of about Q900 (approximately \$115). They have two children – Dilan, 2 and Leslie, 5 months old.

Juan Adolfo's mother, his sister and niece all live in the same house and the four adults and three children sleep in the same room. If not for the extended family, Juan Adolfo would not be able to provide regular meals to his children.

"Let the donor know how very grateful we are to receive this blessing. Please multiply it, Lord," exclaimed Juan Adolfo, expressing his appreciation to God for making it possible.
