#### **Rates**

Be involved with international missions at a fraction of the price! Mission groups pay only \$12 per person per day or \$6 per person per half-day to cover the cost of materials used while on site. Midwest Mission's 32-person capacity dormitory costs \$50 per room per night. Six rooms have two sets of bunks beds, and the two corner rooms in the dorm have one set of bunk beds and two twin size beds. We also have 13 full-hookup campsites that are \$30 per night and a duplex on campus which costs \$50 a night and sleeps two.

### **Mission Volunteers**

### Who Can Be Part Of This Mission Journey?

- Individuals and groups can come and work for a few hours or several consecutive days.
- Mission volunteers must be age 18 or older.
- Adults must chaperone youth in groups at a ratio of 1:5 for youth groups 14-18 years old; 1:4 for youth 11-13 years old; and 1:1 for youth under 11 years old.
- It is advised that male and female chaperones are in attendance for youth groups with male and female individuals.
- · All ability levels are welcome.
- Mission volunteers will be asked to work in pairs to assist one another with the day's activities.

### **Campus Facilities**

- Dormitory: Available to individuals and groups to reserve for overnight accommodations.
