COVID Help

St. Vincent Volcano Eruption



School Principal God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. – Psalm 46:1 NIV

Thanks to you, Midwest Mission was able to send student kits and other relief supplies to the people of St. Vincent who were affected by the volcano that erupted on April, 9th, 2021.

About 20,000 people were evacuated from the area nearest to La Soufrière volcano on the northside of St. Vincent after it began erupting on April 9 for the first time in 42 years.

These kits were delivered on April 28th and were unpacked and delivered to schools by the Principal himself, along with two young boys who hoped to continue their education and complete school!

MIDWEST MISSION STUDENT KITS were taken to Florida in March in a cooperative effort with Food for the Poor to pre-stage disaster response items in ten Latin American and Caribbean countries. Student kits are used to help children emotionally after they have been affected by disaster, giving them a way to express themselves through art or writing. Emotional care after a disaster can be just as crucial as having physical needs met.

Annual Conferences & In-gatherings

Midwest Mission strives to ensure that those affected by a disaster receive the supplies they need to recover. To help secure these supplies our board members and annual conferences are working together to create In-gatherings. These collection sites help us secure the needed supplies for our Midwest Mission kits that we disburse around the world and around the corner to all of those in need during a crisis.

Our largest International Partner is Food for the Poor (FFP). We work with FFP to help with regular humanitarian relief and international disaster response. Internationally we helped with volcanos, hurricanes, flooding and social unrest in Haiti. We also work closely with US Sothern Command's -US military humanitarian missions.

You will see the cities in the countries we ship to are the same because that is the receiving port. FFP has 17 warehouses in 16 Caribbean and Latin American countries where supplies are taken from the port and given to vetted nonprofits throughout the country.

The Blessing of Student Supplies in El Salvador

"The school supplies will benefit many children in the country, as we plan to distribute more than 3,000 school kits to children living in vulnerable communities and impoverished areas," explained our in-country partner representative.

"More than 80 organizations have partnered with us in our distribution efforts, including parishes, community development associations, and churches throughout the region. Additionally, children from our own internal programs – Ángeles de Esperanza [Angels of Hope] and Había Una Vez [There Was A Time], were also recipients of the popular school kits."

The Había Una Vez program supports 20 "School Centers" and 25 "Story Corners," all located in areas of high vulnerability. These programs are offered at schools in high social risk communities.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions imposed by the government, many people have been unable to leave their homes to apply for the financial aid needed to purchase essentials such as food and other basic necessities for the family. As a result, many children in El Salvador have had to do without the school supplies that are so essential to their motivation and engagement.







It is the time of year for Midwest Mission to prepare for the many supply requests we will receive for MMDC Student Kits for children in need around the world and around the corner. In 2020, Midwest Mission disbursed 17,494 MMDC Student School Kits valued at \$155,000.00

Basic needs like pencils, crayons, paper, and scissors help students to engage in lessons as they gain the knowledge they can bring back to their community to improve overall welfare. Education is one of the most important keys to breaking the cycle of poverty around the world and around the corner. This is why Midwest Mission is dedicated to serving those in crisis - to help them thrive through education and feel God's love in a practical way.

Student Kits & Desks to Honduras



In June, MMDC Student kits and desks were delivered successfully to children of Honduras who had lost everything in hurricane Eta. These students were able to start a new school year fully equipped, which brought pure joy and excitement! These kits and desks were delivered right after the school was rebuilt and kids were preparing for inperson classes.

Heydy Bu, a Food For the Poor in-country representative told Midwest Mission, "During a follow-up visit to the school, for the reopening of classes, we also managed to distribute the beautiful student desk chairs and tables that were included in this shipment. This particular school was greatly affected in both Hurricanes Eta and lota, and they pretty much lost all of the school furniture they had." Functional school desks and new school supplies from our donated kits make school a much more comfortable and positive experience for all of the children and helps relieve financial pressure from the families and the local schools.

A Gift of Great Magnitude to Guatemala



Midwest Mission sent Guatemala a firetruck! The firefighting capability of the Volunteer Firefighters of Guatemala will greatly improve with the recently-donated gift of a fire truck!

According to the representatives of Volunteer Firefighters of Guatemala, "We are most appreciative and grateful for this gift of great magnitude, that will save lives and property of the Guatemalan people. May God bless you for having this gesture with us. A gesture that will help us save the lives of those in peril. That is our objective – to save lives. We are not affiliated with any political party, and we represent all Guatemalan people. For us, all lives are valuable. We only hope to be able to help."

Fires have continued to be an issue in Guatemala, especially forest fires that break out from the dry and hot weather they experience. In May of 2020, Guatemala had 1,157 active fires. Guatemala currently has many impoverished areas that face these fires and a fire truck provides substantial aid! The firetruck debuted in early February, less than a month after it was donated, and helped put out a local house fire. Midwest Mission has also sent personal firefighting equipment to use and wear during fires. Firefighters said it was a blessing and helped them respond quickly and prevent the spreading to the entire neighborhood! <u>God Bless!</u>

On January 10 of this year, Midwest Mission lost its founding father and was able to honor him at a memorial on May 1st. Dr. Rev. Jack Travelstead had visited Haiti on multiple mission trips and assisted with disaster response in multiple flooding disasters in the late 1990s. Jack had the vision to start a distribution center that would be centrally located in the Midwest and still help people around the world. Jack was a force of nature. He believed in people and the importance of meeting practical needs. He also knew whom to call to get the job done, and he had a way of asking that made it hard, or impossible, to say "no". He dreamed big dreams and made them a reality when Midwest Mission opened in 2000. We continue to dream big and reach beyond what we think is possible year after year and to push Jack's dream farther because if we have learned anything from our founder, it is that anything is possible with faith and determination.

Midwest Mission has placed a plaque honoring our esteemed Founder in the Midwest Mission kit room for all to see. The quote from Jack that was chosen for this plaque reflects his life's work: "People want and need to feel that they have worth. People who lose their resources lose a sense of worth. We want to help them rebuild and start again. As people of faith, we believe that we are part of a global community. The people we reach out to are our brothers and sisters. May our gifts reflect our genuine respect, love, and concern for these members of our family around the globe."

COVID Help to Developing Countries

Midwest Mission has sent hundreds of thousands of bottles of hand sanitizer, masks, hygiene, and cleaning products to assist vulnerable populations of children, the elderly, and the disabled through our partner Food for the Poor and their non-profit partners to help reduce the spread of COVID-19.





The first case of COVID-19 in Haiti was registered by the Ministry of Health in March 2020. The recommended preventive measures are not easy to implement for most Haitians who lack access to water for handwashing and masks. This was the case for the Missionaries of the Poor, a non-profit residential facility for special needs children and young adults with multiple disabilities. With the help of Food for the Poor and Midwest Mission, they were able to receive masks and hand sanitizer. The staff were educated to use the sanitizer at a specific time each day to help keep the children safe. This facility is the best hope for these children - staying safe so they can stay open is crucial.
