You Can Help Send 1,500 Wheelchairs to Honduras!

A while ago, Chantel Corrie, Executive Director of Midwest Mission, received a book from a faithful volunteer named Dan Blank. The book, Miracle Wheels, opened her eyes to a staggering reality: 80 million people around the world need a wheelchair, according to the World Health Organization.

"I was shocked by that number," Chantel said. "The vast majority live in developing countries and don't have the means or access to get a wheelchair. The thought of someone being forced to crawl or be carried because they couldn't afford a wheelchair ... it was heartbreaking. All that stands between them and a life of independence is a simple piece of equipment."



While we knew we couldn't provide 80 million wheelchairs, we also knewe could be part of the solution. That opportunity came during a trip to Honduras this past March. While visiting CEPUDO's warehouse with our partner Food For The Poor, we were introduced to the wheelchairs donated by Free Wheelchair Mission, the same organization featured in Miracle Wheels. These are beautifully made, custom-fitted wheelchairs designed for those who meet specific medical criteria.

But not everyone qualifies. And that's where we felt called to step in.

"Right there in the warehouse," Chantel recalled, The Holy Spirit revealed the gap we were meant to fill, getting wheelchairs to people who don't qualify for these custom chairs, but are still in desperate need."

We asked CEPUDO how many wheelchairs were needed in the hospitals, children's homes, and nonprofits they serve.

Their answer? 1,500.

And so this Wheelchair Initiative was born.

We're inviting you to help us meet this urgent need.

The Sewing Space: A Donation Story



We recently heard a heartwarming story from one of our generous donors.

This donor gifted 10 sewing machines to Midwest Mission. She shared that her mother used to host a group of women in her home, where they would gather to sew lap robes for senior centers, a tradition they kept going for over 20 years!

When her mother could no longer

sew, she and her husband decided to donate all of the machines to their affiliated church, so they could continue being used for good. Their daughter later took over and created a permanent sewing space, complete with more than 20 machines, cutting tables, and donated fabric. This space became a welcoming, designated area where women could come together and sew anytime.

As newer machines were donated over time, they eventually found themselves with more machines than they had room for. When they heard about Midwest Mission's use for sewing machines, they knew exactly what to do with the extras.

It is so heartwarming to know that these 10 machines have been passed down through generations and handled with such care and love. Now, we get to find them a new home, bringing opportunity and empowerment to people around the world. What a beautiful legacy to carry forward!

Thank you to the ladies from The Sewing Space for your generous donation. Your story is truly inspiring, and we are honored to give your machines a second life while continuing to spread hope across the globe!



Serving September is Right Around the Corner!



Serving September is less than a month a way — have you thought about how your community can participate?

In past years, Midwest Mission has celebrated Serving Sunday, a day to celebrate the joy of serving. But, this year we decided celebrating for a whole month sounds a lot more fun!

Serving together brings people together, and the impact we make is multiplied when we all work together. You, your church, your small group, or your community can join us in a variety of ways — there's something for everyone!

Ways to Participate:

 Collect Items — You could choose a specific Kit to collect items for, pick a few used items to collect, or choose our current needs! All items listed at <u>midwestmission.org/collect-donate</u> and <u>midwestmission.org/kits</u> are needed,

- and will bless people who will receive them.
- 2. **Assemble Kits** Choose a Kit, collect items for a couple weeks (or purchase items ahead of time), and then host an event where people can assemble the Kits. This is a great community-building project, and allows people of all ages to get involved.
- 3. **Make Handmade Items** If you or someone you know loves to sew, knit, or crochet, there are a lot of projects you can do! Visit midwestmission.org/patterns to see the different items.
- 4. Host a Mission Event If you'd like to host a big event through Midwest Mission, we have some days and weekends in September available (especially if you are willing to pick up supplies from Midwest Mission). Visit midwestmission.org/off-site to learn more.
- 5. Hold a Fundraiser Midwest Mission is blessed with an abundance of donated items, but that doesn't cover everything we are asked to send! Midwest Mission purchases most of the items volunteers assemble and send out. It costs an average of \$1,500 per day for the Kits volunteers make at Midwest Mission. You can hold a fundraiser raising funds for Kits, so that we can send more items to people in need around the world and around the corner.

Help Reach the Goal of Making 2,500 Student Kits

While there are a variety of ways to get involved, this year, we've set the goal of 2,500 Student Kits to be made during Serving September, so we have enough Student Kits to be pre-staged before the 2026 Disaster Season.

These Kits are vital for giving kids a way to cope with the trauma that



comes from disaster. Whether stateside or around the world, Student Kits give children the chance to just be a kid, even when chaos ensues around them.

How?

- 1. Collect Supplies
- 2. Assemble the Kits
- 3. Deliver the Kits to Midwest Mission or a Permanent Collection Site near you
- 4. Impact Lives!

This Church is Looming Love into every Mat!

A wonderful group of ladies from Avon United Methodist Church recently gathered to complete a special service project. Their small group, called Koinonia, met to create Midwest Mission Sleeping Mats using one of our looms. Together, they made over 57 Sleeping Mats made entirely from recycled grocery sacks!

Their dedication was so inspiring that someone at their church arranged for them to receive a second loom, allowing them to double their production. They were also given a designated space in the church, now lovingly called their "Loom Room." Since then, they've begun distributing the mats to HVAF (Helping Veterans and Families), the American Legion, and two other local organizations that support and feed people experiencing homelessness.



It's been an exciting and meaningful journey, combining environmental management with compassionate service. By reusing old grocery bags, they're helping the planet while also helping people sleep more comfortably.

Koinonia has also taken their mission a step further by teaching others how to loom. They've shared their skills with kids, men, and seniors, some from their church, others from the community. They even partnered with their local DAR (Daughters of the American Revolution) chapter to teach the bag-cutting process. Over time, they've begun experimenting with different creative patterns, turning the mats into both functional and beautiful gifts.

This project has been more than just a service opportunity; it's been a source of joy, learning, and connection. They've found it deeply fulfilling to use their hands and hearts to help others. In addition to making mats, they now offer lessons to anyone interested in learning the loom process, from properly cutting the bags to assembling the final product. Local churches and community members have stepped up to donate bags, creating a ripple effect of generosity and teamwork.

"I would like to say thank you to Midwest Mission for putting this on our radar. The fellowship and sense of belonging this project has given us is hard to put into words. It helps those in need, recycles for a better environment, and brings people together," said Koinonia member, Michele Pitts.

This story is incredibly heartwarming and meaningful to us. Stories like these are exactly what make our work at Midwest Mission so rewarding. Hearing about this group of devoted volunteers giving their time and talents to such a worthy cause means the world to us. Even more meaningful is the fact that they've found local organizations to directly receive the mats, ensuring their impact is felt immediately by those in need.

This is exactly what we dreamed would happen with our looms, and we couldn't be more thrilled.

Thank you to the ladies of Koinonia and everyone who has contributed to this project. Your hard work and dedication are helping to send hope and empowerment to those facing dark and difficult times.

Supplies Sent to 10 Countries in 1 Shipment! (Plus two more shipments this week!)



This was a busy week! There were three shipments that were sent out, bringing our total number of international shipments for the year to 43. We are only seven shipments away from our goal of 50!

One shipment in particular was very special. It was an Angels of Hope shipment, but it was different than most. Usually AOH shipments contain Personal Dignity Kits, Home Care Kits, cleaning wipes, mattresses, and Bed Packs. These items go to Children's Homes to help supply the necessities the homes can't afford to purchase for all of their kiddos.

But, for this shipment, they specifically requested Student Kits for the Children's Homes, as the beginning of the school year draws near. We were ecstatic to meet this need, and Brad Walton, Director of Operations, worked with Food For The Poor

to put together the perfect shipment. The 40 foot container was filled with 6,160 Student Kits, and, because of a recent donation of new toys by an anonymous corporate donor, we were able to add over 4,500 games and puzzles for the Children's Homes as well.

These Kits that you worked hard to make, donated funds toward, or prayed for are going to be a big blessing for students in 10 different countries. This container is heading towards Florida, where they will load the supplies onto 10 different containers, along with donations from other organizations. Then, it will be shipped out, and distributed to Children's Homes throughout each of the countries.

The Children's Homes struggle to afford school supplies for all of the children in their care. Because of you, they won't have to! They can use their available funds for food, clothing, and other necessities instead.

Thank you for being a huge blessing to so many kids around the world!

The total value of this shipment was \$136,225.00.



We had two more shipments this week —both to Guatemala!

The first was a normal Angels of Hope Shipment, containing:

- 480 Home Care Kits
- 6 Mattresses
- 6 Bed Packs
- 560 Personal Dignity Kits
- 42 Cover Them With Love Quilts
- 900 New Stuffed Toys (corporate donation)

The value was \$40,244.00.



The second shipment was full of requested supplies, packed into a 40-foot container. It included:

- 200 Layette Kits
- 90 Birthing Kits
- 294 Cover Them With Love Quilts
- 1298 Little Boy and Girls Outfits
- 9 Treadle Sewing Machines
- 16 Mattresses
- Orthopedic boots, splints, and braces
- Dust Masks
- Scrubber Sponges
- Other medical and hygiene supplies

The value of this shipment was \$167,050.50.

MAKE A WILL MONTH



August is National Make-A-Will Month and we know that writing a Will is one of those tasks that can fall by the wayside, because it's hard to think about our own mortality.

Creating a will prevents family conflict, eliminates confusion, and ensures your assets go to the people you most want to have them. It also gives your family guidance and reassurance that they can fulfill your wishes during what is likely a very difficult time for them.

With a Will, you can also plan ahead for those who are in your care — for example, you can name a legal guardian for your minor children, choose a caretaker for your pets, leave gifts to your grandchildren and favorite charities.

We boldly ask that you prayerfully consider remembering Midwest Mission as you make your important decisions. As a nonprofit organization who does not receive state or federal funding, and never has, we are grateful for you, our volunteers, donors, and partners who choose to include us as part of your Legacy.

We have even heard some of you say, especially at Annual Conferences, that you have already named Midwest Mission as a beneficiary. We are honored to be included.



Disaster Relief Sent to Milwaukee After Flooding



On August 9-10, severe flash flooding impacted the city of Milwaukee, Wisconsin and its surrounding area. The storm brought more than 9 inches of rain within 24 hours, a rare event for this part of the country.

Sewer systems were overwhelmed, and many basements flooded as the rain continued to fall. Because of the level of damage in so many communities, Milwaukee County declared a state of emergency.

Last week, just days after the floods came, Midwest Mission was contacted by the Wisconsin Annual Conference's Disaster Response Coordinator. They were hoping Midwest Mission had disaster relief that could be sent to Milwaukee — and we definitely did. Because of your generosity, Midwest Mission is able to pre-stage disaster relief supplies on our shelves, so that when a disaster happens, we are ready to quickly respond.

On Monday, August 18th, Ramon Ortiz, Operations Manager, drove a semi-truck full of disaster relief to the Salvation Army in Milwaukee. He delivered 1,344 Hygiene Kits that will bless families that have been displaced from their homes, or who have lost everything. He also delivered 864 Cleaning Kits that will help people begin to clean out affected and damaged homes.

While there, Ramon was able to talk with Benny Benedict, the Director for Emergency Disaster Services for the Wisconsin and Upper Michigan Division of the Salvation Army.

Benny shared, "The preliminary numbers coming in were worse than expected — I can't share the specific numbers because they aren't yet confirmed, but we are talking about thousands of people who have major impacts on households. The need is great, and we've been working with assessment teams. The biggest request we have is for the Cleaning Kits."



The Salvation Army isn't just


concerned with the physical well-being of Milwaukee residents, but their mental and spiritual condition as well. Benny continued, "We have been out there with our chaplains doing some emotional and spiritual care. This is pretty hard on people. It's pretty devastating out there — worse than we've ever imagined. It's not just a wet basement. We are remaining resolute to continue helping people, and working with partners (like Midwest Mission) to meet needs."

On Tuesday, the Salvation Army reached out again, because all of the supplies were completely distributed by Tuesday afternoon! They requested more Cleaning Kits.

So, Brad Walton, Director of Operations, and Ramon worked on Wednesday to pull all but two pallets of Cleaning Kits off of our shelves, and load them onto the semi trailer.

On Thursday, August 21, Ramon drove back up to Milwaukee to unload the additional 972 Cleaning Kits.

Now, our shelves are empty!



We need your help to replenish our disaster relief supplies, so we are ready for the next disaster.

*One important note: Funds donated directly to UMCOR do not come to Midwest Mission or the Relief Supply Network. Funds donated to UMCOR are sent as grants to the affected community, but are not used to purchase disaster relief supplies. Midwest Mission does not receive funding from UMCOR to make and send these needed Kits. Please consider donating to Midwest Mission if you want supplies to go to future affected areas.
